




ARRAN BIRD REPORT 1989

INTRODUCTION

1989 proved to be an interesting year with pride of place going to the two Cranes which visited us for the first time ever in September (see the article "Uncommon Common Cranes").

The success of this report depends on its contributors and every year more and more information is received from visiting and local birdwatchers alike, to all of whom I am very grateful. It may appear a simple matter to include everyone but somehow names are missed from the acknowledgements, and my apologies to Lawrence Baxter who has submitted most valuable breeding information, also to Chris Calvey, R.A.Dubbins, Tony Smith and T.Walsh.

The BTO/SOC/WC Breeding Birds Atlas is into its final year and help would be appreciated. Contact D.Warner, Brodick Country Park if interested. Help would also be welcome with regard to the regular monthly counts of estuary birds for the BTO.

The heatwave summer was good for some species such as Chats, Warblers, Tits and a few more Nightjars, but the vole crash did not help others like Owls, Kestrels and Hen Harriers and in the case of the latter, together with Ravens, persecution cannot be ruled out. Many nests of Swallows and House Martins failed, possibly due to lack of suitable mud, but numbers seemed low. In spite of there being a slight hiatus in Mink numbers, they are still with us and do a lot of damage to sitting birds such as the Fulmar. Help with trapping would be welcome.

CHRONOLOGICAL SUMMARY

JANUARY-MARCH

A mild start to a rather uneventful month found a Shelduck on 1st January and 2 back on the 3rd at Clauchlands. 68 Fieldfares were discovered in the Ross near Glenrigh and a large flock of 200 Skylarks on Kilmory farmland on the 7th. A Barn Owl favoured Kingscross on the 11th and a Sparrowhawk on the 12th when also a wintering male Blackcap was at Kildonan. The first Gannet was not seen until the 26th off Whiting Bay. A Peregrine and a Greenshank were at Tormore on the 29th at which date Ravens were discovered nest building. A Golden Plover was on territory on Beinn Bhreac on 10th February and 2 Moorhens were unexpected at Shiskine on the 12th. A large movement of Divers occurred on the 16th when 16 Black-throated were in Whiting Bay and 11 Black-throated in Largybeg Bay along with a solitary Red-throated. This date also showed 5 Razorbills close inshore feeding in Whiting Bay. 2 Snow Buntings were in a Machrie field and a Dipper was singing his spring song in Machriewater on 23rd. The 1st March brought an unexpected Long-eared Owl to Clauchlands while on the 11th and 12th Catacol boasted a splendid summer plumaged Red-necked Grebe, 3 Great Northern and 2 Black-throated Divers. Migration was underway by 23rd when the first Wheatears arrived at Brodick followed on the 27th by a Sand Martin at Pirnmill, a Swallow at Sliddery, A Chiffchaff and a Whimbrel at Whitefarland. Following gales over the Easter weekend a Little Auk flew south past Pirnmill on the 27th. 2 House Martins found their way to Brodick on the 31st.

APRIL-JUNE


The 1st April found the first Willow Warbler at Lochranza although most did not arrive until the 13th. Another diver movement occurred on 8th between Machrie and Imachar when 8 Black-throated, 2 Great Northern and 1 Red-throated Diver were in Lamlash Bay. 8 White Wagtails were at their favourite place in Kildonan on 15th while the 16th brought a Tree Pipit to Cordon. Common Sandpipers appeared at Brodick on 18th and Grasshopper Warblers to Lamlash on 19th. 2 Sandwich Terns arrived on 25th and another Whimbrel at Drumadoon. The first Cuckoo of spring was heard at Machrie and Glen Shurig on 27th with 5 more Sandwich Terns and a Wood Warbler by 28th. A Kingfisher was a surprise at Torrylinnwater on 29th and another or same at Pirnmill on 30th. More migrants came in May with Common Whitethroat on 3rd and Sedge Warbler on 6th at Clauchlands and a Whinchat at North Sannox. The 7th provided a Spotted Flycatcher at Monamore and 2 more Whimbrels at Clauchlands plus a third at Machrie from 9th - 14th. A Blackcap was at Largybeg on 10th and a Swift went by Kildonan on 11th about which time Arctic Terns appeared on Pladda. A Garden Warbler was at Clauchlands on 19th but probably the most unusual bird in May was a Coot in the sea at Cordon on 22nd. A Pied Flycatcher singing at Lochranza on 25th has not been seen for several years, so has to be the rarest bird of the month. The first young Shelducks were hatched by 28th and the first young Eiders by 29th. The breeding season was in full swing by early June. A corncrake made known its presence on the 1st at Shiskine while 3 Kittiwakes were onshore at North Sannox at the early date of 8th. Redstart and Ring Ouzel were not recorded until 11th. 20 late Turnstones were on Pladda on 12th and a Stock Dove was unusual on the path to the Fallen Rocks on 14th. Young Herons were bill clacking in Whiting Bay on 22nd, a Grasshopper Warbler was reeling from bracken at Kingscross on 26th while 3 were at Torbeg on 27th.

JULY-SEPTEMBER

During the quiet hot month of July a pair of Siskins feeding young on thistle seeds was a pretty sight at Kingscross on 2nd. An early Arctic Skua was heading south past Catacol on 4th. 20 Swallows on wires in Kildonan as early as 5th may have been failed breeders, however, another Kingfisher was discovered on 8th, this time on the Blackwater at Torbeg. A Black-tailed Godwit was a pleasant find at Torrylinnwaterfoot on 11th and Machrie held a Common Scoter on 28th. A happy ending to the month was the discovery of a family of Ptarmigan on Goatfell on 31st. Some autumn movement was apparent on 13th August when 6 Sandwich Terns and 4 Dunlins were found at Blackwaterfoot. Stormy conditions on 14th found 300 Manx Shearwaters flying south past Whiting Bay with more on 15th. More wind on 18th and 21st during the Brodick-Ardrossan crossing revealed a seldom recorded Sooty Shearwater, 2 Storm Petrels, a Puffin and a Bonxie (Great Skua). A Bar-tailed Godwit showed up at Clauchlands on 23rd and 4 White Wagtails were with 50 Pied Wagtails at Kildonan on 25th. Another Arctic Skua appeared on 27th on ferry crossing from Brodick. There was a large movement of 500 Meadow Pipits at Blackwaterfoot on 28th while 13 Dunlin and a solitary Sanderling were present at Kildonan on 31st. The 1st September saw a Whimbrel at Cordon while the 6th held 2 Sandwich Terns at Whiting Bay. Large families of Long-tailed Tits now began to appear while 70 Linnets had formed into a flock at the Cleates. 5 early Goldeneye had turned up at Machrie and a Great Skua went by Catacol on 7th. Yet another Arctic Skua was seen from the Brodick ferry on the 22nd. The 23rd provided excellent views of a Goshawk at Lochranza, but the limelight was stolen by the two Cranes at Shiskine from 26th until 1st October. A Pink-footed Goose was unusual at Blackwaterfoot on 29th and a late Corncrake was calling at Shiskine on 30th.

OCTOBER-DECEMBER

It is not often we have a Little Tern but Clauchlands held one on 8th October, so on the one hand we had summer migrants leaving, such as hirundines and a Whinchat on 14th, while on the other winter visitors began to arrive in the form of 10 Greylags at Shiskine and 30 Redwings at Glen Rosa on 15th. Waders were on the move by 18th with 40 Golden Plover at West Bennan and a single Knot at Whiting Bay with 34 Turnstones and Ringed Plover that peaked at 100. 8 Whooper Swans were a surprise in the sea near Corrie on 22nd and a tardy Wheatear remained in Kerr's Port until 30th. On 4th November 24 Goldfinches charmed one observer in Lamlash. As Black Grouse have practically died out on Arran, it was unusual to find a male near Cnocan Loch on 14th. A Little Auk flew close inshore at Machrie during strong SE winds on the 16th by which date Fieldfares had begun their annual invasion with large concentrations around Kingscross, Auchencairn and Gortonallister. 180 Rooks was a large number for our wintering population at Shiskine on 19th. A very late Swallow was in Brodick on 24th and 25th found a very early Shelduck back at Bennan shore ready to hold territory for next year's breeding. Goldeneye were by now well distributed round the coast and our wintering pairs of Mute Swans had taken up residence in Whiting Bay, Lamlash and Brodick. The 28th saw a male Blackcap in Glenashdale. December began with 4 Bullfinches at Kingscross on 1st. Greylags had built up to 400 at Shiskine by 6th while Clauchlands produced a Water Rail on 7th. Perhaps the most interesting sighting of this rather dull month was a Great Grey Shrike at North Sannox on 26th followed by 2 Snow Buntings on Torr Nead on 27th. A pair of Ptarmigan were seen twice on Mulloch Buidhe during November and December which brings the year to a seasonal close.



UNCOMMON COMMON CRANES

As the R.S.P.B. has now disclosed one of the best-kept ornithological secrets ever, that several pairs of Common Cranes (Grus grus) have nested successfully in Britain over the last nine years, it is therefore not so surprising that two of these lovely birds turned up here in the Shiskine Valley last September. As their timing coincided with a Royal visit from the Princess of Wales, they were reported to be two security men in disguise! Word quickly spread, and as they stayed from 26th September until 1st October, this delighted some keen birders, although strangely for such large birds, they managed to disappear frequently during that time, disappointing more than a

Loud trumpeting calls heralded their arrival just before dusk on 26th September as they circled and landed in a stubble field beside the Blackwater. About 4 feet tall, these large long-legged, long-necked grey birds with tail "bustles" surprised Hugh Hamilton and Alex McMillan who were the first to see them.

Next day several of us admired them from a distance as they fed in the stubble, long necks raised turn about on guard duty. Both adult birds, each had a black head and throat extending down the front of neck with distinctive white cheeks continuing down sides of neck. No red on the head was visible at a distance. Being extremely wary, they often took wing and this showed the contrast of their grey bodies with long extended black-tipped primaries which were separated and up-curled at the ends. The flight was truly majestic, interspersed with long glides and soaring. They sometimes circled up to the arable fields around High Fiorline or disappeared into marshier ground at Balnacoole.

On 30th September at 1.30am people coming from a dance at the Kinloch Hotel were surprised to find them at the Blackwater river mouth. They were last seen at 10am on 1st October in Tornacraig field between Monyquil on the String and Glaister. Let's hope we may have the pleasure of a return visit from these most distinguished birds. This is an important first record for Arran.






