INTRODUCTION

Our final report for the 20th century, and it turned out to be a very interesting year. The list of no-shows was fairly long - red-necked and Slavonian grebes, brent geese, scaup, common scoter, water rail, corncrake, nightjar, grey plover, little stint, black-tailed godwit, arctic skua, waxwing, black redstart and tree sparrow, all of which have been recorded in recent years. However, 1999 saw the return of great crested and red-necked grebes, goshawk and Iceland gull. There was also the continued presence of the great spotted woodpecker and black grouse recorded last year. Added to this we have at least one new addition to our checklist - a scarlet rosefinch. Two other rare species were recorded - a possible greenish warbler and a great shearwater. However, the greenish warbler record was discounted owing to insufficient evidence, while the great shearwater record is still under consideration. On a more mundane note, we have acquired a resident magpie which arrived in November and is still present at the time of writing., the only one ever to stay more than a few days. This is one species we do not wish to see established!

The Arran landscape continues to change as clear felling by Forest Enterprise opens up new areas. Some of the forestry walks which were closed owing to storm damage last year have been re-opened, but sections of the Monamore Forestry will be closed to the public for some time to come owing to timber extraction. Two paths have been re-instated - the Fairy Glen walk, starting at the edge of the forestry below Cnoc na Dail and emerging at the back of Brodick, and the path up

to Loch Garbad. Work is in progress on the improvement of both upland and lowland paths under the auspices of Scottish Natural Heritage, Arran Access and European Objective One. Port-na-lochan has been improved with a planting of small trees and shrubs close to the pond which should encourage more birdlife into the area.

In April, 15 volunteers again carried out an eider census as part of an ongoing Clyde Estuary/Argyll project organised by Bob Furness and Chris Waltho. The total for Arran was 1161, but a follow-up census in September gave a much lower total of 278. In May Terry Southall visited Pladda, and apart from his ringing work there, made a survey of the breeding birds.

Finally, many thanks to everyone who phoned or wrote to me with information. A special thanks too to John Rhead who has once again helped to prepare this report, and to the other experienced birders who helped with identification problems and other matters.

Again, all I need to know is how many, where and the date. I appreciate that counting birds can be difficult, especially redwings and fieldfares for instance which are restless and liable to take flight at the least disturbance, but even a rough estimate is better than "lots of"! The date too is important, as it can be used to cross-reference sightings. Please check the status of species given at the back of this report. You will then understand that we have a very different situation compared to the mainland, and why a magpie is listed as occasional, while golden eagles are resident and common! Beware too of the hybrid mallard which you won't find in your bird book, and the hybrid geese which are often seen in the company of the mute swans. They are not genuine wild birds and therefore are not in the Report.

CHRONOLOGICAL SURVEY

Very wet and windy but relatively mild weather prevailed for most of JANUARY. The first pair of Clauchlands shelducks arrived on the 1st. Three purple sandpipers were back at their usual site at Drumadoon Point on the 2nd, while a red-throated diver turned up at Clauchlands on the 3rd. A further two were at Blackwaterfoot on the 6th, while seven pairs of fulmars were back at Drumadoon cliffs. Also on the 6th were ten bullfinches in the Dunfion Forestry, an unusually high number. Three golden eagles were soaring over the Narrachan on the 7th. A scarce tawny owl was at Brodick Country Park on the 9th. Nothing special until the 22nd, when about 30 goldfinches were at the Cleat, an unusual January sighting. Two groups of long-tailed tits were seen, 12 at Porta Leacach on the 21st and 12 at Arranton on the 24th. More finches were foraging on the Cordon shore on the 23rd, and with them about 50 siskins. Two goldfinches came to a bird table in Brodick on the 29th, and first record of them doing so. Last sighting of note for the month was of a great spotted woodpecker in Merkland Wood on the 31st, still present from last year.

FEBRUARY began with some bright sunshine, but from then on the weather reverted to prevailing north westerly winds, bringing rain, sleet and hail showers. By the 2nd, four goldfinches were coming to the same Brodick bird table. The number of mute swans coming to their feeding station in Whiting Bay had risen to 26 on the 3rd. More news of divers, with a dead black-throated washed up on Lamlash shore on the 4th, and three great northerns at Dougarie on the 10th. The first merlin of the year was seen at Levencorrach on the 13th, while two scarce yellowhammers were at High Kildonan. On the 15th, two pairs of crossbills were picking at grit on a Kilmory road. A long-tailed duck turned up at Blackwaterfoot on the 23rd, the same location as last year, while a short-eared owl was in Glen Rosa. A large flock of about 300 chaffinches had gathered at Benlister on the 27th, and a dead buzzard was found at Glenkiln Farm, probably a victim of the severe weather.

A chilly start to MARCH but there was also plenty of sunshine. Plenty of interest too, starting with four short-eared owls on Kilbride Hill, two pairs of dippers at North Sannox, and about 20 passage skylarks at Kilmory on the 4th. The 6th was a busy day, with three little grebes at Lochranza, two pink-footed and a single white-fronted goose with about 400 greylags in the Shiskine Valley, 10 golden plovers at Machriewaterfoot, and 10 razorbills off Largiemore.

A kestrel had four fledged young at Benlister on the 5th, later reduced to one, probably due to nesting carrion crows a short distance away. A great crested grebe was a surprise at Machrie on the 12th, seen by a group of experienced birders (including me!), and a scarce snipe was drumming at the Boguille summit on the same day. A golden eagle being mobbed by a pair of peregrines at Glen Craigag was a spectacular sight on the 13th and an adult puffin was seen from the Ardrossan/Brodick ferry on the 12th and 13th, the only record of the year. A ptarmigan with three young was seen on Beinn Bharrain on the 21st, but there was also the exciting news of two red kites mobbing a buzzard between Thunderguy and Pirnmill. However, the description didn't quite fit, and after much consultation with raptor experts and the realisation that although the observers had seen red kites in Wales, they might not be familiar with other raptor juveniles such as young eagles, it was decided to discount the record.

A visit to Pladda on the 25th by our resident ringer Terry Southall established that there were c200 pairs of herring gulls, c30 pairs of common gulls, c20 pairs of lesser black-backed gulls, more than 20 pairs of black guillemots and most importantly 15 pairs of arctic terns nesting (some of them ringed). Final note for the month was of a moorhen with three young at Corriecravie pond on the 26th, the first breeding record since 1988.

After one of the wettest JULYs on record last year, we had a really warm month with temperatures between 70 and 80 degrees at the weekend starting on the 9th and again at the end of the month.

Two woodcock were sitting in the middle of the String road on the 3rd, not the first time this has been reported. A red grouse with two young was seen at Lochan a Mhill on the 10th, the only breeding record this year, while a golden plover was calling near Coirein Lochan, indicating possible breeding. A young cuckoo was being fed by its foster parents at Glen Iorsa on the 11th. A grasshopper warbler was at Blackwaterfoot on the 13th, and a second one was reeling at the Lakin Farm on the 25th. A juvenile heron with a broken wing at Lagg was taken into care on the 20th, but died later the same day. Also on the 20th a juvenile crossbill came to a bird table at Pirnmill, the first one to do so. A passage of 70+ willow warblers in five hours took place between Kildonan and Bennan Head on the 25th. A pair of peregrines at Glen Sannox were being mobbed by kestrels on the 28th. By the end of July, the Clauchlands shelducks had left, taking their nine surviving juveniles with them.

The good weather continued into AUGUST with several really warm dry spells, but by the end of the month there was a distinct autumn nip in the air and the rain returned.

Small groups of guillemots totalling 80 were seen from the Brodick/Ardrossan ferry on the 3rd. An agile sparrowhawk took a house martin at Lagg on the 4th. Eight tree pipits flying east in four hours were recorded at Porta Leacach on the 11th. The 11th was also a good day for waders at Kildonan, with five dunlin, 28 ringed-plovers, 17 turnstones, and best of all two adult and three juvenile knots, the adults still in their beautiful summer plumage with rusty red breasts. The first fulmar young were seen, with 1 at Cleiteadh Buidhe on the 12, two at Drumadoon on the 20th and a single at Imachar on the 22nd. At Porta Leacach, 840 Manx shearwaters were seen in one hour flying south on the 15th. A leucistic blackbird turned up at Blackwaterfoot on the 19th, and like the previous one at Lamlash this one was also pure white. More news on the 24th when one of the parents of the young barn owls found drowned in a disused water tank in Lamlash last year was found fluttering helplessly on the ground. In this case it was found to be severely undernourished and later died after being taken into care.

Excitement on the 28th when a great shearwater was seen from the Lochranza/Claonaig ferry. The record is at present under review by the Scottish Rarities Committee, and if accepted will be a first for Arran. The month ended with an unusually high number of 250 pied wagtails at a roost in Kildonan on the 31st, and a migrant osprey overflying the Boguille summit, the only record of the year.

A mixed bag of weather for **SEPTEMBER**, but there were some bright sunny days, particularly the 9th/10th and 25th/26th. More golden plovers were seen, with two at Machrie on the 2nd and a larger flock of 18 in farm fields at West Bennan on the 18th. A second barn owl in trouble was found near the Fallen Rocks on the 12th, where it was seen flapping helplessly before falling into the sea. It was rescued and taken into care, but sadly it too failed to survive. Five goosanders were at Whiting Bay on the 15th, an unusually high number. A late sand martin overflew Brodick Country Park on the 17th. 153 rooks gathered at Drumadoon on the 20th, a new location for them. The third pair of breeding mute swans was seen with a juvenile at Machriewaterfoot on the 21st. The last Sandwich terns were at Clauchlands on the 23rd, while a massive build up of kittiwakes began with about 1500 at Catacol.

The 23rd was also a good day for finches and their associates, with two greenfinches, 10 goldfinches, about 40 linnets, a pair of stonechats and surprisingly a late whinchat. More waders, with a sanderling and a whimbrel at Blackwaterfoot on the 24th, and more than 100 ringed plovers and two knots at the same location two days later. A skein of 40 to 50 returning greylags overflew the Roddin on the 25th. The last wheatear was seen at Blackwaterfoot on the 28th.

OCTOBER may have been one of the warmest ever recorded down south, but here although it started off sunny and mild, the wind veered to the east on the 18th and we had a week of very cold and windy weather.

As usual October was full of interest, and quite a few surprises, starting with a red-necked grebe seen at Kildonan during the first week, last recorded in 1993, while young swallows were still being fed at their nest in Shedock. A late common sandpiper was at Porta Leacach on the 3rd. On the 4th two whooper swans tried to join the mute swans at their feeding station in Whiting Bay, but were chased away. Twelve pairs of wigeon returned to Kildonan on the 6th. Four divers far out to sea off Kings Cave on the 8th were identified by their distinctive calls as great northerns. The first returning goldeneye appeared at Whiting Bay on the 10th. golden plovers demonstrated their marvellous camouflage Machriewaterfoot on the 15th. The strong north-easterly winds brought winter visitors from Scandinavia, with a single brambling at Lochranza and about 500 fieldfares and redwings overflying Dippen on the 16th. A second leucistic blackbird was seen at Glenashdale on the 21st, but this one only had a pied head. Very early returning shelduck were seen, a pair at the Cleat on the 24th, and a single at Kildonan the following day, only recorded once before in October since records began.

More exciting news on the 24th, when a juvenile scarlet rosefinch was mist netted, ringed and photographed at High Kildonan, a first record for Arran. A small insignificant greyish brown bird, had it turned up anywhere else on the island, it would probably have been overlooked. By the end of October, Tony Smith who had been doing regular counts of kittiwakes round the island reckoned that there were 5440 or more, the greatest number ever recorded here.

NOVEMBER is usually a very wet month on Arran, but the mild October conditions continued into the beginning of November. The wind then veered to the north, bringing bitterly cold but dry and sunny conditions for almost a fortnight before turning back to overcast rainy weather.

A group of 39 redshanks was at Whiting Bay on the 3rd, the largest number ever recorded there. The late departure of some summer migrants continued, with the last swallow at Shedock on the 3rd. On the 5th John Rhead struck lucky with a possible greenish warbler in his garden at Kilmory. Like the yellow-browed warbler he recorded in 1995, this one also comes from north eastern Europe. Sadly, the record was disallowed owing to insufficient evidence. Sandbraes was in the news on the 9th, with two willow warblers, the latest departure ever recorded, and the unwelcome arrival of two magpies. Later on, a single was reported at Kings Cross on the 14th, and it is still here at the time of writing, the only one to stay more than a few days since records began. On the 12th an immature little gull turned up at Blackwaterfoot. On the 14th a dead kestrel found at the foot of cliffs near the Fallen Rocks was found to have been ringed as a nestling on the 5th June on the west coast of Sweden. A scarce tufted duck was seen at Port-na-lochan on the 18th, but there was a bigger surprise there on the 21st when a kingfisher flew in to take up residence. Another surprise on the 21st with a 1st winter Iceland gull at Kildonan, last recorded in 1994. A flock of 20 greenfinches with 30 goldfinches made a colourful sight at the Cleat on the 23rd.

Overcast weather predominated in **DECEMBER** as expected, but there was another bitterly cold spell during the third week when the wind veered north again. Although there were high winds, at least we were spared the devastation of the gale on Boxing Day last year.

Not much to report, with three single barn owls at Machrie Moor, Machrie Farm and Auchencar on the 13th, a little grebe at Strabane gravel pit on the 19th, a single returning gannet in Lamlash Bay on the 22nd, and about 100 wigeon off Levencorrach on the 29th. Best news came last, with a flock of 21 barnacle geese with the greylags in the Shiskine Valley on the 29th. With them was a single very striking goose, with a snow white head, black chin extending in a sloping line down the neck, slate grey vermiculated back, and orange-pink bill and feet. This was later identified as an emperor goose probably the same one mentioned in the Ayrshire Bird Report 1997

Red-throated Diver

Breeding: bred at min 2 inland lochans. Singles and prs seen all yr round the coast, with max 4 Blackwaterfoot 26 Sep.

Black-throated Diver

1 dead Lamlash beach 4 Feb; singles and prs seen all yr round the coast with max 9 Kings Cave 27 Apr; more summer sightings than usual with pr N Sannox picnic site 14 Jun, 1 adult 2 juvs same location 17/18 Jun and 1 Machrie 28 Aug.



Breeding: nested successfully at Drumadoon (2 yng fledged), Cleitadh Buidhe (1 yng fledged) and Imachar (1 yng). No news from other colonies at Dippen, Dunfion or Holy Isle. Max 61 Drumadoon Pt 6 May.



Great Shearwater

Probable Kilbrannan Sound 28 Aug (C.Rogers). Record awaiting ratification from Scottish Rarities Committee.

Manx Shearwater

Most sightings were from the Brodick/Ardrossan ferry, with first 2 5 Jun and max 200+ 24 Sep; seawatches produced 100/1hr Largiemore 26 Jun and 840/1hr Porta Leacach 15 Aug. Last sighting 2 Largiemore 26 Nov.

Gannet

Lower nos than usual, with 1 Porta Leacach 21 Jan; 2 Pirnmill 29 Jan; 1 early return Lamlash 22 Dec; max 30 Largiemore 26 Jun (cf 100+ 1998).

Cormorant

No breeding records. Pladda was checked out as a follow up of the 1998 breeding cormorant survey, but there was no evidence of breeding. Groups of up to 6 seen round the coast all yr, with max 9 Hamilton Rock 29 Nov.

Shag

Breeding: 70 prs breeding on Pladda 25 Jun. No report from Holy Isle. Very common round the coast all yr.

Grey Heron

Breeding: 1 carrying nesting material White House Woods 8 Mar, 3 nests later, result not known; injured juv Lagg 20 Jul taken into care but died later; 3 prs nested Lagg, 5 yng fledged Mainly singles round the coast all yr, larger groups incl 9 Strabane gravel pit 6 Oct, 9 Lochranza 4 Nov and 11 overflying Arranton 30 Nov.

Mute Swan

Breeding: Fish Fm pr laid 3 eggs below high tide line, washed away by 17 May; second attempt successful with 5 yng, reduced to 4 by 20 Jun; Clauchlands pr successful with 5 yng, reduced to 4 by 23 Aug; 3rd pr at Machriewaterfoot seen with 1 juv 21 Sep; possible 4th pr at N Sannox picnic site with 3 yng 26 Sep; further inc in nos with prs also seen at Pirnmill, Lochranza and Kildonan, with max 28 Whiting Bay 20 Nov.



Sparrowhawk

Tree Sparrow

Chaffinch

Breeding sample: 2 successful nests Mount Pleasant, Lamlash. Very common and widespread, especially at bird tables during winter. Max c300 Benlister 27 Feb.

Brambling

Only 1 record of 1 Lochranza 16 Oct (A.Handley).

Greenfinch

Breeding: adult carrying nesting material Mount Pleasant 31 Mar; pr with 2 juvs Catacol, adult with 4 fledgings Mount Pleasant, Lamlash 17 Jun; yng at Bailemargaidh 27 Jun. Common and widespread all yr, with max 20 with goldfinches Cleat 23 Nov.

Goldfinch

Breeding: pr feeding 4 fledglings Mount Pleasant, Lamlash 3 Jun. Further inc in sightings especially during winter months. Common and widespread all yr except Dec, with max c60 Cleat 24 Oct.

Siskin

Breeding: adult feeding fledgling Arranton 20 May; pr with 2 yng High Kildonan 23 May. Common and widespread all yr in suitable habitat, but fewer than usual at bird tables during winter months. Max c50 Cordon shore 23 Jan.

Linnet

No breeding records. Common and widespread Apr/Nov, with up to 8 on the E coast and South End; larger flocks incl 18 Cleat 4 Apr; 27 Shiskine Golf Course 21 Aug and max c40 Kerrs Port 23 Sep and Blackwaterfoot 28 Sep.

Twite

Inc in sightings with 4 (1 singing) Kilpatrick 25 Apr; 3 Rinn a'Chrubain 22 Aug; 4 Blackwaterfoot 23 Aug; 3 Shiskine Golf Course 12 Sep. Max 12 Blackwaterfoot 23 Aug.

Redpoll

No breeding records. Scarce, with all records Apr/Jun; m at bird table Whiting Bay 20 Apr; pr Ross road 30 Apr; 5 Kings Cave 2 May; 2 Whiting Bay Golf Course 13 May; 1 Kings Cross 16 May; max 10 overflying Kings Cave car park 18 Jun.
