INTRODUCTION

Our first report of the 21st Century, and like 1999, a very interesting one. The list of no-shows included barnacle goose, long-tailed duck, osprey, grey plover, black-tailed and bar-tailed godwits, great skua, common tern, redstart, ring ouzel and lesser whitethroat, all of which have been recorded in recent years. However, this was counterbalanced by the return of black-necked grebe, brent goose, scaup, common scoter, water rail, little stint, arctic skua, little tern, turtle dove, waxwing, black redstart, and best of all, hawfinch. Two of these, hawfinch and turtle dove have not been recorded for many years, 1983 for the former, and 1988 for the latter. Another record, that of two choughs overflying the Boguille in February is under consideration. If allowed, this would be the first record for over 100 years, 1863 to be exact! Corncrakes and nightjars have been absent for some years now, but there is still a chance that they may return. There were no new additions to the Check List, as the Great Shearwater record in August in 1999 was finally disallowed by the Rarities Committee. The magpie (our one and only) which arrived in November 1999, finally disappeared in April, presumably to find a mate. I'm just relieved it didn't find one here!

Further improvements continue to be made to upland and lowland paths by Scottish Natural Heritage, Arran Access and Europe Objective One. If you walk in the forestry areas, be prepared to find some paths closed off due to timber extraction. A new path has been created by Albert Holmes at Auchenhew Glen, leading up to the waterfall at the head of the glen. With spectacular views, it is almost complete and the final stretch should be ready for Easter.

Volunteers once again took part in an eider survey, as part of the ongoing Clyde Estuary/Argyll project. Terry Southall, our resident ringer, returned to Pladda in June, and as well as his ringing work, provided a survey of breeding birds. Peter Tupman who organised the

WeBS counts, and Duncan Stevenson, Head Ranger at Brodick Country Park, have left the island. Both were valuable contributors to the Bird Report, and will be greatly missed. Sincere thanks to all those who wrote to me or phoned with information. Thanks too to John Rhead who helped with the preparation of this report, and other experienced birders who helped with identification and other matters. All I need to know is how many, where, and the date. Please check the status of species given in the Check List at the back of this report. Visitors may be surprised to learn that some species which may well be common in their area are scarce or even rare here. Moorhens are a good example at the last count we had two! Please don't ignore the little brown birds, or LBJs as they are known. Pipits, wrens and dunnocks are under reported every year! Beware too of hybrid mallards which won't be in your bird book, and likewise the three geese with the mute swans. They are also hybrids and are not genuine wild birds.

CHRONOLOGICAL SURVEY

January

The first record for the year came from Margnaheglish with a pair of bullfinches, the first of five records for the month, an unusually high number for the time of year. A pair of black-throated divers was at Sannox on the 3rd. A party of ten long-tailed tits made an attractive sight at Lamlash on the 9th. The kingfisher still present at Port-nalochan from last year was seen on the 14th, but was gone by the end of February. On the 15th, c20 guillemots, three razorbills and a single redthroated diver was seen off Largiemore, with further singles at Fallen Rocks on the 18th and Sandbraes on the 23rd. On the 16th there were 34 ravens and five reed buntings at the Cleat, while 186 greylag geese were counted at Shiskine. The maximum number of eiders recorded for the year, c750 in all, were seen off Brown Head on the 19th. Winter blackcaps appeared at bird tables, a female at Cordon and a male at Dippen on the 24th. 14 pairs of fulmars were back at their ledges at Catacol on the 26th, and two merlins were seen from the library van parked at Shiskine on the 28th! The month ended with a pair of goosanders at Machriewaterfoot on the 31st.

February

Good news to start the month, with a flock of 24 lapwings at Shiskine and a further 12 at Slidderywaterfoot on the 6th. Two crow-type birds with red beaks and feet overflying the Boguille on the 7th were surely choughs. The record is under consideration, and if it is allowed would be the first record for over a hundred years - 1863 to be exact! Six white-fronted geese were feeding in a field at the Knowe Farm on the 9th. An astonishing 21 grey herons were grouped on what used to be the front lawn in the White House grounds on the 11th, while the first hen harrier of the year, a male, was seen at Shiskine on the same day. A further 18 white-fronted geese were at the Torr Righ flooded marsh on the 17th. A mixed flock of 40 fieldfares and six redwings was noted at High Kildonan on the 18th, and more importantly, a female black

grouse (or greyhen) at High Glen Cloy on the same day. A visit to Port na Feannaiche on the 19th produced 11 teal and c230 curlew. A scarce red-necked grebe turned up at Pirnmill on the 22nd. A flurry of excitement on the 24th when a goshawk overflew Brodick Golf Course, seen by a visiting RSPB group. A winter flock of 32 skylarks was at Machrie, and a single purple sandpiper at Drumadoon Point on the 25th. The first four returning gannets were seen off Torrylinnwaterfoot on the 27th. By the 28th the greylag numbers at Shiskine had built up to 450, while there was a single goosander on the Kilmorywater.

March

The first group of six migrating whooper swans overflew Kilmory on the 1st. A single returning lesser black-backed gull was seen at The Heights on the 7th, rather later than usual. Also seen during the first week were 15 rooks at Corriecravie, but surprisingly there were none at Shiskine or Blackwaterfoot. A pied wagtail was at its nest at Kilmory on the 17th and subsequently hatched three young. Six pinkfooted geese and a single white-fronted were seen with the greylags at Shisking on the 18th, while the first wheatear arrived at Kilbride Hill. The first seven linnets of the year were at the Cleat, and a large flock of 37 rockdoves at Torrylinnwaterfoot on the 19th. The next two summer migrants to arrive were two chiffchaffs at Porta Leacach on the 21st, then three swallows at Machriewaterfoot on the 26th. A flock of about 15 snow buntings was also seen on the 26th on Goatfell. A male brambling, the only one of the year, turned up again at a bird table in Murray Estate, Lamlash on the 28th where it stayed for three days. Final note for the month came from a garden at North Newton where a pair of treecreepers were seen trying to squeeze into a tit nest box on the 30th.

April

A very busy month with many arrivals and departures. A kestrel was in the news on the 1st when it flew into the side of a telephone kiosk in Glen Cloy while chasing a chaffinch. Both birds were temporarily stunned, but the chaffinch shook itself and flew off, while the kestrel

was taken into care and later released apparently unharmed. The next summer migrants to arrive were five sand martins at Auchencar on the 6th, followed by four sandwich terns at Machriewaterfoot and two at Blackwaterfoot on the 8th, then a willow warbler at Dippen on the 10th. On the 11th there were 14 golden plovers at Machriewaterfoot and four house martins arrived at Kildonan. During a second week, a dead female merlin was found on the balcony of a house in Brodick, no doubt victim of a window strike. A female woodcock with two young was seen on Holy Isle, and a single twite and the first common sandpiper of the year at Kilpatrick on the 18th. The last of the fieldfares and redwings, 120 and 6 respectively, were noted at High Kildonan, also on the 18th. The first six white wagtails were seen at the Cleat on the 20th. The last winter goldeneye was seen at Clauchlands on the 21st, while a cuckoo arrived at Lochranza on the same day. A peregrine with a plucked mallard was at Glenree on the 22nd. On the 23rd, the last of the greylags, a skein of about 100 overflew Kings Cross, while an arriving whinchat at Pirnmill had the misfortune to be eaten by a cat. The most important news of the year also came on the 23rd, when a male hawfinch in full breeding plumage came to a bird table at Murray Estate, Lamlash. The last one in July 1983 was found dead, but this one was very much alive and several people got the chance to admire it. More arrivals, with a garden warbler in the White House grounds and four whimbrels on passage on the 24th, then a grasshopper warbler reeling at Machrie Moor and a wood warbler at High Kildonan on the 28th. a sedge warbler at Lagg on the 29th, and a whitethroat at Kildonan on the 30th. Meanwhile, after almost daily phone calls reporting its progress between North Sannox and Sandbraes, our one and only magpie was last seen on the 29th.

May

A good start, with a male black redstart seen at Kilmory on the 1st. By the 5th the Clauchlands shelduck had nine young, five of which survived to leave with their parents in late July, while a song thrush had four fledged young at Mount Pleasant, Lamlash. Despite their steep decline on the mainland, song thrushes continue to do well here. More whimbrels on the 6th, this time a group of seven and a single at Blackwaterfoot. On the same date a short-eared owl was seen chasing a pair of hoodies on Machrie Moor, and the first arctic tern was at Blackwaterfoot. A spotted flycatcher arrived at Brodick Country Park on the 9th and a sanderling on passage was at the Cleat on the 10th. A gap in arriving migrants until the 20th when a tree pipit arrived at Brodick Country Park. Some action at the Benlister burn on the 20th, when a heron was watched as it saw off a buzzard, and a family of grey wagtails with four young had a narrow escape when attacked by a sparrowhawk. More arrivals on the 22nd, with up to three swifts at Corriecravie, while the house martins were busy gathering mud in the North Sannox quarry on the 26th. The northern pair of eagles were feeding one young by the 28th, and final sighting for the month was of a sub-adult Iceland gull at Glenashdalewaterfoot on the 29th which was still present at the beginning of June.

June

The first sighting of the month was the welcome return of the turtle dove, last recorded in 1988. This one was at Braehead Farm, Sliddery, on the 1st, and was seen there again on the 10th and 11th. Clauchlands pair of mute swans had six cygnets by the 6th, two of which survived, while only 1 cygnet at the Fish Fm survived. The Fish Farm pen was sitting on her third nest by the 18th. The two families frequently met in the middle of Lamlash Bay, and there were spectacular disputes over territory. By the 7th a ringed plover had successfully hatched three young after nesting in the pebbled driveway of a house at Arranton, thanks to the owner taking great care when parking the car! On the same day a male crossbill was seen on the Dunan shore picking over the seaweed, a most unusual place to see one. A pair of oystercatchers with one young was seen attacking a pheasant which had strayed into their territory at Glen Rosa on the 14th. The first ten Manx shearwaters were seen off Largiemore on the 15th, and the only puffin of the year the following day. Two ptarmigan were noted on the 17th, a male on Meall Donn, and a female on Mullach

Buidhe. The sand martins had a better breeding season, with six nests at Kilpatrick on the 24th, one of which had five well grown young, while there were about 20 nest holes at the North Sannox quarry with a minimum three young on the 30th. Terry Southall, our resident bird ringer visited Pladda on the 29th, and as well as his ringing work, provided a breeding survey of the island. In addition to the large numbers of nesting gulls and shags, there were four pairs of nesting arctic terns. Two pairs also nested at Dougarie, and although eggs were seen, it is not known if they hatched. A ringed gannet found dead at Sliddery on the 30th proved to have been ringed on Ailsa Craig in June 1985.

July

Manx shearwater numbers were building up, with a maximum of about 200 off Pirnmill on the 8th. Also on the 8th, a single red grouse was seen at Cnoc na Croise, a species that remained scarce after a poor breeding season. On the 9th, there was the unusual sight of a curlew perched in a large bush in a garden at Blackwaterfoot, until it was realised that there was a chick on the ground underneath it! Good news came on the 10th, with two pairs of long-eared owls feeding young in the Kilmory plantation, while family parties of redpolls were in the same area on the 15th. Seven swifts were at Dippen on the 20th, an unusually high number for Arran, while on the same day a pair of black guillemots were at their nest underneath Brodick Pier, seemingly oblivious to the activity overhead. On the 22nd, 12 golden plovers overflew Coirein Lochan, a little grebe was at Corriecravie pond (a very unusual summer sighting), and a further two ptarmigan were on the summit of Goatfell. A scarce knot in summer plumage was at Blackwaterfoot on the 26th, and a pair of red-throated divers with one young were seen at Machrie. Finally, more waders, with 12 dunlin at Blackwaterfoot on the 27th, only one of which was still in summer plumage.

August

Few sightings at the beginning of the month, but a pair of blackthroated divers was seen on Loch Tanna on the 5th and a tree pipit at High Kildonan on the 12th, the only other sighting of the year. During the second week, one of the mute swans at Whiting Bay was seen swimming round in circles. Brian Wilson of the Royal Hotel decided to investigate, and it was found to have entangled one foot in a lobster pot. It was freed and swam off, apparently unharmed by the incident. A gathering of 50+ ravens was at Dunfion on the 15th. A large flock of 250 goldfinches was feeding at the Cleat on the 19th, and there were also five white wagtails there. On the same day, a short-eared owl was seen at the Urie Loch, and two scarce sanderlings at Machrie. A pair of moorhens was seen at Machrie pond on the 21st, the only pair on the island as far as is known. An immature knot turned up at Whiting Bay on the 22nd, and two adults at the Cleat on the 31st. Kittiwakes began to arrive at Whiting Bay with about 40 on the 22nd, rising to over 200 by the end of the month. A tawny owl was heard at Bailemargaidh on the 24th. Unlike the barn owl, this species has never been common on Arran, and the only other record was of one at Brodick Country Park in April. Two scarce species followed, with a single arctic skua seen on the Ardrossan/Brodick crossing on the 25th, and a little tern at Brodick on the 27th. Last notes for the month were of a female hen harrier chasing a peregrine near the summit of the Laggan path on the 29th, and a little stint at the Cleat on the 31st.

September

A month mainly of departures and arrivals, starting with the last fulmar at Blackwaterfoot and two early returning wigeon at Kildonan on the 2nd. A maximum 27 redshanks were at Whiting Bay on the 3rd, and a large flock of 60 greenfinches at South Kiscadale on the 5th. By the 8th, the number of kittiwakes at Whiting Bay had risen to 240. Observers watched a peregrine take an oystercatcher on Blackwaterfoot beach on the 11th, and are now the proud possessors of a painting by bird artist Philip Snow illustrating the scene! Although many summer

migrants had already left, swallows were still feeding young at Kilmory on the 15th. More raptor news, with four kestrels interacting with two ravens on Creag Mhor on the 16th. The WeBS count at Machrie on the 17th produced good results, with a moulting flock of 78 red-breasted mergansers, a female goosander, 45 turnstones, 120 ringed plovers, and two of our rarer waders, a greenshank and a little stint. 13 knots at Drumadoon Point on the same day was an extra bonus, as well as up to 10 rooks seen at Shiskine. Unusually the rooks were not seen again at that location. More songbird flocks were building up with about 200 siskins at Whitefarland on the 22nd, and up to 100 goldfinches at Catacol on the 24th. Last note for the month was of a sparrowhawk being mobbed by meadow pipits at Corriecravie shore on the 29th.

October

The month started with a juvenile gannet found injured on Holy Isle on the 1st. A scarce female tufted duck turned up at Port-na-lochan on the 2nd, and was joined by what was thought at first to be a second one on the 11th. After consultation, it was decided that the second duck was in fact a female scaup. Two hen harrier juveniles were chased being mobbed by a pair of hoodies on Kilbride Hill on the 12th. A good view of a female merlin from a bus at the summit of the Boguille on the 14th as she flew alongside for a short time, while on the same day another tufted duck was seen at Clachan. More winter visitors arrived, with eight greylags returning to Shiskine, and 24 fieldfares at Kings Cross and 120 with six redwings at High Kildonan on the 18th. On the 21st, a black-necked grebe was seen Pirnmill, and by the 22nd a little grebe had returned to the Rosa burn area. The 22nd was also the day the Clauchlands cygnets were seen on the wing with their parents for the first time. Two rarer species of geese on Arran joined the mute swans on the 24th at their feeding station in Whiting Bay - three brents and a single pinkfoot. The second black redstart of the year, a female this time, turned up at Shiskine on the 29th. Final note for October was of a possible great grey shrike at Sannox on the 30th, but the sighting was too limited to be certain.

November

Welcome visitors from the north when a pair of whooper swans returned to join the mute swans at Whiting Bay on the 1st, but more importantly, they brought their three fully grown cygnets with them, the first seen on Arran. The last swallow was seen in Whiting Bay on the 2nd. A group of up to 30 waxwings arrived at Glen Cloy on the 6th after an absence of two years. By the 11th, the number of wigeon at Kildonan had risen to 48. Another female black redstart was perched on a roof at Kilmory on the 15th. On the 16th, a big flock of 580 common gulls had gathered at Blackwaterfoot. The goldeneve were late coming in, possibly because of the mild weather conditions, and the first four were seen at Lamlash on the 19th, by which date the number of greylags at Shiskine had risen to more than 200. The 20th was a good day for rarer species, with a snow bunting on the summit of Goatfell, and a ptarmigan just below. Another rare species, the elusive water rail, was spotted creeping along a ditch at Clauchlands on the 23rd. The month ended on a sad note, when a dead golden eagle was It had been ringed in Sutherland which represents a considerable movement for this species.

December

A big flock of about 50 collared doves were gathered in Whiting Bay on the 1st. Two not so common common scoters were seen from the Brodick/Ardrossan ferry on the 2nd. On the 5th, another whooper swan join the mutes at Whiting Bay, while the first returning pair of shelducks arrived at Clauchlands on the 7th. Yet another female black redstart appeared in the timber yard at Brodick Pier on the 8th. Nine rooks came to feed at Corriecravie on the 11th, but there were still none at Shiskine or Blackwaterfoot where they have overwintered in recent years. The last house martin was seen in Whiting Bay on the 12th, the latest ever recorded here. It was still very mild on the 15th, and a song thrush was in full song in a Whiting Bay garden. Three pairs of bullfinches were at the Letter, Lamlash on the same day. It was predicted last year that the number of mute swans at their feeding

station in Whiting Bay would increase, and so it proved with 47 on the 17th. On the same day, 52 golden plovers were on the shore at Machriewaterfoot. Another tufted duck appeared on the 24th, this time at the Urie Loch. A snipe startled a householder in Kilmory on the 27th, when it almost hit her in the face as she opened the front door. More snipe, a wisp of six was seen at Sliddery on the 29th. The year ended with a single waxwing at High Kildonan on the 30th, and a skein of 39 greylags wheeling over the farm fields at Clauchlands, their loud cries echoing over Lamlash Bay.

Red-throated Diver

Breeding: no records, but probably bred on inland lochans. Singles and prs seen all yr round the coast, with max 4 Largiemore 24 Apr and 4 Machrie 5 Sep.

Black-throated Diver

Prs and singles seen round the coast all yr except Jun/Jul, with max 4 Machrie 24 Apr. Pr seen at Loch Tanna 5 Aug was the only inland record.

Great Northern Diver

Prs and singles seen between Lamlash/Imachar Mar/Aug, with max 3 Blackwaterfoot 23 Apr.

Little Grebe

Singles overwintered at Lochranza, Rosa burn and Fish Fm. Single at Corriecravie ponds 25 Jul was unusual.



Fulmar

Breeding: nesting colonies at Drumadoon, Catacol and Cleiteadh Buidhe, but success unknown. Seen all round the coast Jan/Sep, with max 48 Drumadoon 25 Feb.

Manx Shearwater

Most sightings from ferry crossings Jun/Sep; 8/10 Balearic race Ardrossan/Brodick 30 Jun, with max c600 Largiemore 28 Aug; last 6 Ardrossan/Brodick 11 Sep.

Gannet

Seen round the coast Feb/Oct; nos remain low, with return 4 Torrylinnwaterfoot 27 Feb, and max 15/20 Whiting Bay 2 Apr; injured juv found on Holy Isle 1 Oct; 1 found dead Sliddery 30 Jun was ringed on Ailsa Craig 28 Jun 1985.

Cormorant

Groups of up to 7 seen round the coast all yr. Max 13 Cleat 31 Aug.

Shag

Breeding: 70 prs nesting Pladda 29 Jun; also bred on Holy Isle. Seen all yr round the coast, much commoner than cormorants. Max c100 Largiemore 20 Apr.

Grey Heron

Breeding: 1 carrying nesting material White House Woods 10 Feb; 3 prs nested Lagg Wood, 1 pr with min 2 yng 21 Apr. Common round the coast all yr, with max 21 White House Woods 11 Feb.

Mute Swan

Breeding: Pr + 3 yng Fish Fm 9 May, reduced to 1 by 24 Jul; pr + 5 yng Machriewaterfoot 27 May, reduced to 4 by 11 Jun; pr + 6 yng Clauchlands 6 Jun, reduced to 2 by 21 Jun. Further inc with max 47 Whiting Bay 17 Dec.

Whooper Swan

6 overflying Kilmory 1 Mar; 1 Clauchlands May/Sep; pr returned to overwinter at Whiting Bay 1 Nov with 3 imm, the first recorded on Arran.

Pink-footed Goose

6 with greylags Shiskine 18 Mar; 1 Whiting Bay 24 Oct.

White-fronted Goose (Greenland race)

6 Knowe Fm 9 Feb; 1 with greylags Shiskine 18 Mar; 3 Rodden 21 Mar.

Greylag Goose



Breeding: 3 juvs Lamlash 3 Jun; 2 nest boxes in White House Woods, and 2 at Mount Pleasant, Lamlash successful. Singles and prs widespread all yr, especially at bird tables.

Treecreeper

Breeding: pr trying to nest in a tit box N Newton 30 Mar; pr with 5 yng Glenkiln Forestry 27 Jun. Singles and prs seen in suitable habitat all yr, with max 5 singles Auchenhew Glen late Sep.

Great Grey Shrike

Possible 1 Sannox 30 Oct (M.Knox), but insufficient evidence for a record.

Magpie

Single still present from last yr seen almost daily between Whiting Bay and Sannox (incl Holy Isle) Jan/Apr. Last sighting 29 Apr.

Chough

Possible pr overflying the Boguille 7 Feb (M.Strang & J.Kinloch). Record under consideration. Last record was 1863!

.Jackdaw

Breeding: colony at Drumadoon, but no reports from other locations. Very common round the coast and villages all yr, with max 190 Shiskine 25 Mar.

Rook

Normally overwinters in only 3 locations; 15 Corriecravie 1st wk Mar; 8/10 Shiskine 17 Sep; no further records from Shiskine and none from Blackwaterfoot; return 9 Corriecravie 11 Dec.

Carrion/Hooded Crow

Breeding: successful nest Arranton 3 Apr; also nested successfully at High Benlister; 2 yng Margnaheglish early May. Very common and widespread all yr, but no large flocks reported, with max 6 Machrie Moor 5 Feb.

Raven

Breeding: pr nesting Lagg Wood 21 Apr. Common and widespread all yr, with max 50+ Dunfion 15 Aug.

Starling

Breeding: adult feeding 2 juvs Kilmory 17 Jul. Common and widespread all yr, with max 370 Blackwaterfoot 22 Feb.

House Sparrow

Breeding: 3 yng being fed Kilmory 17 Jul. Common round the villages all yr, with max 49 Whiting Bay 15 Nov.

Chaffinch

Breeding: min 2 broods Kilmory May-Jun; also nested successfully at Mount Pleasant, Lamlash. Very common and widespread all yr, with max 50 High Kildonan 19 Feb.

Brambling

m Murray Estate, Lamlash 28-31 Mar (A. & R.Thompson).

Greenfinch

Breeding: nest with 6 eggs Cordon 9 May; 2 broods being fed Kilmory 8 Jun. Common and widespread all yr, with singles and prs feeding at bird tables during the winter months. Max 60 S Kiscadale 5 Sep.

Goldfinch

Breeding: adult feeding yng Mount Pleasant, Lamlash 17 May. Common and widespread all yr, with singles feeding at bird tables during winter months. Larger nos incl 36+ Pirnmill 4 Oct and max c80-100 Catacol 24 Sep.

Siskin

Breeding: pr feeding 3 yng White House Woods 22 May; adult with 4 yng Kilmory 1 Jun. Common and widespread all yr in suitable habitat, with small nos coming to bird tables Jan/Mar. Max c200 Whitefarland 22 Sep.

Linnet

Breeding: nest with 5 eggs Mount Pleasant, Lamlash 17 May. Common at the S end Mar/Sep, with family groups of c20 Clauchlands 10 Aug, 20-25 Kildonan 21 Aug 120-150 Blackwaterfoot 9 Sep. Max 25 Cleat 19 Aug.

Twite

Decrease in sightings with 1 Kilpatrick 16 Apr; 1 Goatfell path 29 Apr; 1 Blackwaterfoot 13 Sep.

Redpoll

No breeding records. Still scarce with pr Kilmory 30 Jun; 1 Blackwaterfoot 4 Jul; family parties Kilmory plantation 15 Jul and max 10-12 Bailemargaidh 24 Jul.

Crossbill


